Hollywood Hills West Neighborhood Council (HHWNC) Ballot Voting Model

The HHWNC Ballot Voting Model has 10 ballot types. Stakeholders can claim multiple stakeholder statuses and may vote more than one (1) ballot.

1) OFFICERS AND ISSUES BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work or own property and also those who declare a stake in the neighborhood and affirm a factual basis for it, can vote for the following races:

- President Vote for one (1)
- Vice President Vote for one (1)
- Secretary Vote for one (1)
- Treasurer Vote for one (1)
- Parliamentarian Vote for one (1)
- Issue 1: Traffic, Public Transportation and Parking Committee Chair - Vote for one (1)
- Issue 2: Youth Development, Education and Recreational Resources
 Committee Chair Vote for one (1)
- Issue 3: Business Issues

Issue 4: Infrastructure

Committee Chair - Vote for one (1)

- Issue 5: Housing, Social and Human Services, Religious and Charitable Organizations Committee Chair Vote for one (1)

10) AREA 9: BRIAR SUMMIT/WOODROW WILSON/MULHOLLAND DRIVE COMMITTEE CHAIR BALLOT

Stakeholders who live, work or own property (and can provide an exact address) in Area 9 can vote for the following race:

- Area 9: Briar Summit/Woodrow Wilson/Mulholland Drive Committee Chair - Vote for one (1)

Summary:

- The HHWNC has 23 board seats. All **23** seats are elected.
- Stakeholders will use **self-affirmation** as a means of establishing their stakeholder status.
- Minimum stakeholder voting age is **18**.
- The HHWNC has nine (9) voting areas.
- The HHWNC Board has a two-year board term.
- Candidates can run for no more than one board seat.
- A factual basis stakeholder can only be issued an Officers and Issues Ballot.
- Stakeholders can vote for one "area" only.
