Tarzana Neighborhood Council (TNC) Ballot Voting Model

The TNC Ballot Voting Model has three (3) ballot types. Stakeholders can only claim one (1) stakeholder status and will be issued one (1) ballot.

1) RESERVED AT-LARGE BALLOT

Any stakeholder (commonly known as a factual basis stakeholder) who is at least 18 years of age on the day of the election claiming stakeholder status because of membership in a community based organization or by whatever other means and who does not "live, work or own property" within the neighborhood council boundaries can vote for a candidate in the following race:

Reserved At-Large Representatives – Vote for up to two (2)

2) NORTH AREA REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT

Any stakeholder, other than a factual basis stakeholder, who is at least 18 years of age on the day of the election who lives, works or owns property north of the Ventura Freeway can vote in the following races:

- North Area Representatives Vote for up to three (3)
- Residential Renters Representatives Vote for up to two (2)
- Homeowners Representatives Vote for up to four (4)
- Business Representatives Vote for up to three (3)
- At-Large Representatives Vote for up to four (4)

3) SOUTH AREA REPRESENTATIVE BALLOT

Any stakeholder, other than a factual basis stakeholder, who is at least 18 years of age on the day of the election who lives, works or owns property south of the Ventura Freeway can vote in the following races:

- South Area Representatives Vote for up to three (3)
- Residential Renters Representatives Vote for up to two (2)
- Homeowners Representatives Vote for up to four (4)
- Business Representatives Vote for up to three (3)
- At-Large Representatives Vote for up to four (4)

Summary:

- The TNC has 21 board seats. All **21** are elected.
- Stakeholders will use **documentation** as a means of establishing their stakeholder status.
- Minimum voting age is **18**.
- The TNC Board has a two-year term.
- Candidates can run for no more than Board one seat.
