

The Innovation Fund is a \$1 million fund designed to provide one-time funds to City departments to test new ideas that could make the City work better. We expect to fund projects that haven't been tried in LA before, that increase efficiency, improve the quality of life for Angelenos, and that are feasible and measurable. LA is the global capital of creativity – and we know that City employees, Commissioners and Neighborhood Councils have great ideas for how we could do our work better. Ideas should be innovative, original, feasible, and measurable, that support greater efficiencies, and emphasize priority outcomes and quality of life. Ideas will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis.

To date, over 20 ideas have been funded through the Innovation Fund, including the following:

Clean Up LA Contest – Public Works: Bureau of Sanitation – \$35,000 – To engage communities in keeping Los Angeles clean, develop a 12-week competition throughout the City's 96 Neighborhood Councils to reduce litter and graffiti, with awards presented to contest winners, and produce marketing materials and outreach plan to raise awareness of the MyLA311 and 3-1-1 helpline to report blight.

Median Design Competition – Public Works: Bureau of Street Services – \$35,000 – Launch a two-month competition to enlist LA-based landscape architects that can help design medians that incorporate native plants and construct pre-approved "kit of parts" to provide some pre-approved options for communities to redesign or overhaul blighted community medians, thereby eliminating red tape.

Smartphone Dispatch of Pothole Trucks – Public Works: Bureau of Street Services – \$90,000 – Improve efficiency and customer service by purchasing GPS enabled-smartphones and support equipment, particularly the Actsoft Comet Tracker software to provide tracking capabilities and improved dispatching and allow service crews to collect information on requests, digitally complete custom forms, and close out requests remotely.

Technology for Neighborhood Councils – Department of Neighborhood Empowerment – \$54,228 – Create a single, comprehensive and computer friendly system that would replace the current time-consuming, paper-based process and provide all 96 Neighborhood Councils the ability to conduct financial business online and allow the Department to track, in real time, all transactions, account balances, and reports.
